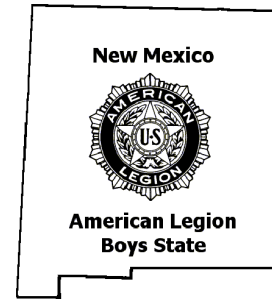

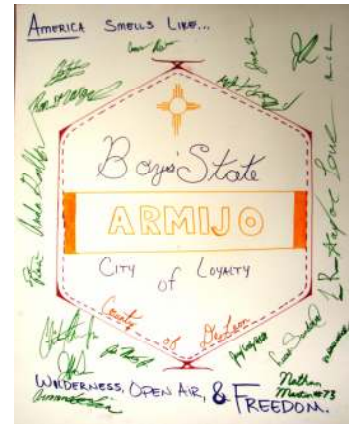

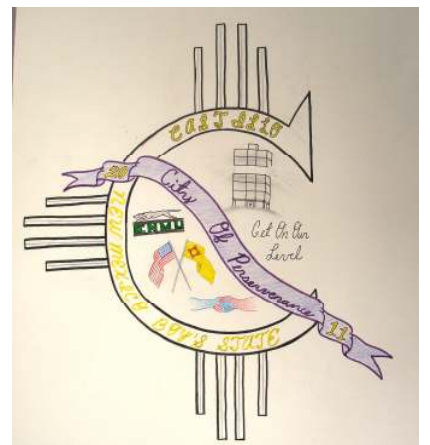
We later broke up into our counties, while the Senators and Representatives took an addi-
